


Story Time: Family Activity Sheet

Family Activities

Make a Necklace

You will need: Scissors

Empty Cereal Box Aluminum Foil Glue Stick One-hole punch Sharpies or Markers String or Cording



Instructions:

- 1. First cut out strips of cardboard from an empty cereal box.
- 2. Use a glue stick to secure heavy duty foil around all sides of the cardboard pieces.
- 3. Decorate the foil pieces with Sharpies or markers with various designs.
- 4. Cut out different shapes and use a hole punch to place two holes on opposite sides of the shape.
- 5. Lace the pieces together with a string or cord.

Create a Paper Hat

You will need: Large sheet of paper OR poster board Colored construction paper Scissors Glue Ruler Protractor or a plate



Instructions:

- 1. Draw two circles onto a large sheet of paper or poster board with a protractor or a circular plate. Using a ruler, draw 8 triangular sections like a pizza in the inner circle.
- 2. Punch a hole in the center and cut across each pizza section's line. Fold the triangular points outward.
- 3. Decorate and cut out paper ornaments or shapes out of colored construction paper. Glue the decorations on to the hat's brim and the tips of the triangular sections.
- 4. Add any additional decorations you make have like stickers or glitter.
- 5. Take a photo in your new hat!
